## India needs to be proactive in Afghanistan

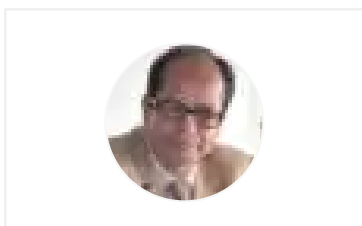
